




process, whereby good politicians and honest business practices should govern the future of South Korea and preserving the moral values of the society in general.

checking whether teachers and doctors are regularly performing their duties; whether benefits of social schemes like PDS, food security Act, MGNREGSA and Awas Yojana are reaching to true beneficiaries or not. Excellent!

To further the concept of good governance, and weed out the corruption, transparency in all processes is being promoted. Using digital technology, scope of discretion has been declining. From auctioning, tendering, and to recruitments, the transparent digital online mode has been successful to fight the corruption and to increase the trust of public towards these institutions, which had been earlier shabered by the scams of 2G auctions and Coal auctions.

Furthering good governance is just one lens to visualise the 'fighting corruption'. Removal of corruption has its repercussions on others aspects of a nation, namely self-defense and patriotism.

The recent CAG audit report on defense preparedness and quality of our ammunitions is the eye-opener to many strategists and policy-makers. For many years, our defense procurements have been saddled with the corruption cases - be it before scam or the alleged leaking of data related to scorpene-class submarines. The CAG even questioned the reliability of missile-defense system in Arunachal Pradesh in defending future attacks from our neighbours.

Therefore, corruption has its bearing on our defense preparedness <sup>and</sup> hence our capabilities to have self-defense.

Fighting corruption is also an important patriotic act. People engaged in this fight are highly motivated by their patriotism, who want their society/country to achieve ~~new~~ high.

Hence, the activists exposing the wrong doings and becoming whistleblowers are guided by public interests only. By exposing the recruitment

scam in Haryana, these activists essentially saved the future of the children (and India) from the vagaries of unqualified teachers.

society, people must be aware about the ill-effects of the corruption. How it is self defence? When you are silent spectator, the next turn is yours.


In this fight against corruption, the role of the government is limited. Until the push comes from the masses, filled with patriotism, the problem of corruption will always persist.

This example signifies the fact past glory or achievements do not automatically translate into today's success.

Past status and experiences (either success or failure) do have certain repercussions in one's

present and future status. But, it is only one of the several factors which decide our fate. Hence, we should be cautious in our approach while being judgemental over the past.

Considering the international relations and foreign policy, there is a relevant saying that there is no permanent friends or enemies, but only permanent national interests. It does not matter what was your past relations with particular country. If national interest demands the cooperation from your enemy, then make her your friend.

Hence, today, there is a general trend of anti-incumbency voting pattern in most of the democratic states. With each election, new leaders and parties become victorious. Leaders have to satisfy the needs/demands of current generation and can not take the comfort on what they have done for the previous generation. Indian National Congress, the grand old party of India, despite being the front-runner in India's struggle for independence, has to provide solutions to present problems in order to remain in power.

At societal level, past attitudes, prejudices, stereotypes toward others are bound to change.


fast changing technological era, and globalised world, one needs to constantly build upon the earlier experiences by applying feedback loop mechanism, ensuring once adjustment with changing environment.
