

brought out the staggering nature of our MLAs' character. One can infer their characters with the alleged events of Horse-trading, vote for money, defections, ~~from party whip~~, resignations, cross-voting and a kind of House-arrest for some MLAs.

It is beyond doubt from such chain of events that the basic duty of these MLAs (to represent the people) is nowhere in the discourse of this power-politics, revealing their true character.

- Similarly, the rivalry/competition between USA and Russia (USSR), often termed as cold war, had revealed the true nature of these powerful countries.

USA, the oldest democracy, has always justified its interference/invasion in other

country's sovereignty in the name of expanding the idea of democracy. Hence, USA interfered in Korean Peninsula, Vietnam, Afghanistan, Iraq and recently Syria. USSR (Russia) on other hand, driven by its own ideology as defender of exploited class, too indulged in their internal politics which recently resulted in mass exodus of Syrian migrants in lakhs of population. However, the results of such interventions are open for everyone to see. Far from defending and protecting basic human rights, citizens of such countries are struggling to feed themselves, living under constant fear of death.

Therefore, this competition exposed the hollow claims of big powers, revealing their true character - might is right; treating others as

Having discussed these issues, however, it would be wrong to say that sports competition do not have any role in character building. Competitions do facilitate the innovations, pushing people to go beyond their limits and develop some positive traits. For example, learning the importance of team work through sports and role of values like trust between team players.

For last 4-5 years, North-West Brazil has witnessed a new trend. Business people in collusion with local people have been rapidly deforesting their millennium old pristine Amazonian forest in lieu of practicing cash crops (Soyabean, sugar). For them, this process involved no cost and within 4 years, thousands of acres of forest land was cleared just by few hundred tribal people. End result being, the Bragadian government has to introduce for the first time - 'DROUGHT RELIEF' for them worth thousands of crores.

Had those people accounted for 1000 crores in advance, such situation would not have emerged.

Today, in our materialistic world every activity (economic) do produce some kind of pollution to the environment. With current technological developments, it can be argued that we are atleast few decades away, before we adopt the 'ZERO-WASTE' principles of production.

Hence, producing the pollution is implicit in any work. However, actual problems start when they do not produce but OVER-PRODUCE when people do not produce beyond their actual needs and requirements. It is mainly because they are

not paying the actual cost associated with the pollution.

Taking examples from our daily lives (especially urban life) - for a middle-class person, activities like vehicle water washing, not switching off the electrical/electronic appliances and not letting an engine off during the red traffic light are trivial matter to be worried. As he/she can easily afford the water bill, electricity bill and fuel bill respectively. For him/her, water, electricity and fuel are just commodities to which he/she can buy lots of fossil fuels. But what about the water wastage and environment pollution (air pollution) he/she has been creating? What about the external

The inherent opportunity cost vis-a-vis environment pollution (environment cost) is missing from the public discourse not only at individual level, but at national and international level.

Measures of development = GDP, GNI, GMP, HDI - do not factor the environmental cost in their calculations. If an mining industry abuses the nearby lake and produces output (say iron-ore), it would be take as positive development. It would not matter whether the same lake was the source of livelihood for local tribal people or how many fishes died because of it.
